TERMS & CONDITIONS

Mission Statement

The Bless Network is a bridge to transform the lives of people in Europe by empowering Christians through prayer, serving others, personal creativity and strategic partnership. Bless programme participants need to be team 'players' and an example to others. You must read and retain the P. A. R. I. S. framework outlined at the end of this application form; it relates to core values and expected attitudes and behaviour of programme participants.

Relationships

Your time working for God with Bless is a fantastic opportunity for you to build on your relationship with God, focus your life more fully on him and dedicate your time to putting Him first in all that you do. For this reason we ask you not to initiate or embark upon a new relationship with anyone whilst you are on mission, including team members and within the placement church. This policy also helps ensure that team and church life will not be damaged. We believe that God will honour and bless you in this.

Servanthood

Servanthood often goes hand in hand with personal sacrifice. The Bless Network is committed to serving the church in Europe. We ask that you will remain respectful of those placed in authority over you and respond to the requests of leadership with integrity. With Jesus as our model of servanthood, our desire is that we will always be a blessing and an encouragement to the host church. Remember, you will be in what is essentially a different culture to what you may be used to; participants must be sensitive to the customs and lifestyle of those around them.

Conduct

Participation on the programme is dependent on your willingness to abide by these terms and conditions and to refrain from conduct likely to bring The Bless Network into disrepute. In extreme circumstances, we reserve the right to withdraw you from the mission and repatriate you.

Finance

*The fee (e-mail info@bless.org.uk for details) must be paid in full 4 weeks before departure or your place may be forfeited; A £120 / €150 deposit is required on acceptance of your application. The fee covers your travel, accommodation, travel insurance cover, food, local transport and any relevant training. Please note that the mission events are carefully planned financially in advance to keep costs down; because of this **the deposit and fee are non-refundable**. Please make GB £ cheques payable to The Bless Network, or contact the Bless office for our bank details if an inter-bank transfer is preferred or if resident outside the UK..*

Insurance

Bless holds group travel insurance cover for all Go2Bless participants while they are on mission, including travel to and from your home address. If you have any specific insurance requirements or medical conditions, please provide details so we can confirm whether or not you need to make any special insurance arrangements. We ask all UK resident participants to hold a European Health Insurance Card – see www.ehic.org. Applicants must be over 16 years of age; parents/guardians of applicants aged under-18 will be required to complete and sign a parental/guardian consent form.

The P.A.R.I.S. framework for service in mission *(please keep)*

The PARIS framework has been developed as a simple and memorable training tool to emphasise that all effective mission needs to be based on an attitude of a servant heart. The framework forms the basis of all Year2Bless and Go2Bless programmes, and asks participants to reflect on five core values.

Philippians 2:5-8 Your attitude should be the same that Christ Jesus had. Though he was God, he did not demand and cling to his rights as God. He made himself nothing; he took the humble position of a slave and appeared in human form. And in human form he obediently humbled himself even further by dying a criminal's death on a cross.

P

PRAYER is the all-important underpinning of all mission activity - the glue that holds everything together. We ask all participants to commit to prayer before, during and after a mission trip, and to see prayer as an act of mission in its own right. Bless mission trips come into being through prayer and will always include a daily pattern of team prayer. Part of what we bring to the locations we work in is a willingness to engage in prayer on behalf of others. We ask participants to put the same energy, commitment and focus into prayer that they would bring to any other more physical or measurable task.

A

ADAPTABILITY is indispensable to travel, team life and ministry. Our teams have slept in everything from a stunning French Chateau to the floor of a poorly-ventilated storage shed. Ministry demands change by the day, and not everything goes to plan! It is crucial to enter into the mission experience with a willingness to adapt and in the sure knowledge that you will be asked to step out of your comfort zones - probably in a number of ways. Our commitment to those we work with is that we will accept even basic accommodation, that we will eat what is set before us and that we will be as flexible as is humanly possible in our efforts to serve their needs.

R

RESPECT is equally a vital ingredient in mission. We ask that each participant respect the leadership structures put in place by our organisations: but even more importantly that they respect the opinions and sensibilities of those we work with. Whilst this sounds uncomplicated, it can become very difficult when views are taken which we ourselves would not normally adopt, in relation for instance to alcohol, smoking, gender roles or worship styles. There may be a time and place to raise questions, but midway through a mission is not it: while a mission is in progress mutual respect is the only viable option. Where our trips are designated alcohol-free, for example, this is a reflection of our willingness to respect local sensibilities. Expect to learn as much as you teach and to receive as much as you give.

I

INVOLVEMENT is a key to effectiveness in mission. We try very hard to adapt our ministry programmes to individual participants, so that each will have the opportunity to operate out of personal strengths and passion. But this will not always be the case. There will be times when participants are asked to fulfil tasks that, given the choice, they would happily avoid. We ask each person to enter as fully as possible into all aspects of ministry and team life: from washing-up to worship and smiling at children to stacking chairs.

S

SERVANTHOOD is the concept that brings all the rest together. It is an easy thing to talk about, but is hard to deliver when you are tired, homesick, stressed, nervous, hungry and well past the end of your tether. Servanthood is the belief that the success, comfort, personal fulfillment and spiritual development of others come before your own. Servanthood recognises that whilst a mission trip may do you good - in terms of experience, development, growth, enjoyment and satisfaction - its primary purpose is to do some good in the location to which you have travelled. There is mutual benefit in mission, but there is also a clear sense of priority. Servanthood captures the 'kenosis' or self-emptying of mission attributed to Jesus in Philippians Chapter 2.
